Subject: Anti-Gambling Rules

Ref. Section 19 of the Notices of Race Governing the Races of:
Valencia Louis Vuitton Act 13
The Challenger Selection Series
The 32nd Match for America's Cup

Section 19 of the Notices of Race for Valencia Louis Vuitton Cup Act 13; the Challenger Selection Series for the Louis Vuitton Cup; and the 32nd Match refer to, and incorporate, the following Anti-Gambling Rules for the Event. In substance, these rules remain unchanged from previous Notices of Race for the Pre-regattas.

Anti-Gambling Rules

1. At no time shall any team member of a Competitor, or any Regatta Official, participate in any gambling, betting, or related activity with respect to the Event, including:
 - (a) accepting a bribe or agreeing to improperly influence the outcome of a race of the Event;
 - (b) betting on any race of the Event;
 - (c) knowingly advising gamblers or associating with gamblers with the intent to assist in wagers on races of the Event; and
 - (d) permitting any other party (including any family member) to engage in any of the prohibited activities above from which the team member or the Regatta Official could reasonably be expected to benefit.
2. Any attempt to improperly influence the outcome of a race of the Event shall promptly be reported in writing by:
 - (a) team members, to their team, and the team shall promptly report it to the Regatta Director; and
 - (b) Regatta Officials, to the Regatta Director (except in the case of the Regatta Director who shall report it to the Chairman of the Jury).
3. The Regatta Director may request and/or the Jury may initiate a hearing upon receiving a report of an alleged violation of this Regatta Notice.
4. The penalty for breaking these Anti-Gambling Rules for either a team member or a Regatta Official shall be their immediate suspension from further participation in the Event. The Jury may determine such additional penalty it deems appropriate; however, a yacht shall not be penalized unless the Jury finds that the Competitor has violated RRS 2. The Jury may also grant redress to a Competitor that has been prejudiced as the result of a team member or Regatta Official who has been determined to have broken these rules with prejudice to a Competitor.
5. If a Competitor becomes aware from a report or otherwise of a member of its team breaking or being a party to breaking these Anti-Gambling Rule, that Competitor shall immediately suspend that team member from all further activity with the Competitor during the Event, whether or not a hearing has been held by the Jury.
